### Son's Story Causes Arrest of His Father on Charge of Murdering His Wife

Flesherton, Ont., Dec. 13.—That the crown authorities believe Henry Love, of Ceylon, killed his wife on Monday night, concealed her body in the cellar of their house and hid the crime until Wednesday at midnight, even from his 14-year-old son, Arnold, is indicated in the arrest of Love at 5 o'clock to-night on the order of Provincial Inspector Reburn, following a prolonged interview between Reburn and the boy. A motive for the crime is missing and the only possible one is the story of the son, as told by Inspector Reburn, would point to the woman having been killed in a fit of passion, following one of the spats such as the boy says his father and mother sometimes had. Mrs. Love was deeply religious and was much opposed to the use of tobacco, which was the husband's only known habit. The boy's story also implies that the revelation of the crime was the result of a threat of a neighbor to make a thorough search of the house.

the father suggested that as it was stormy she would probably remain away for the night. FATHER LOST HIS TEMPER When the son made enquiries again on Wednesday night the father lost his temper. The father and mother used to have little spats occasionally and the father was quite short-tempered at times. Gibson Collinson, who had visited the home on Wednesday night, remarked on leaving that they would come and make a thorough search of the house on Thursday. It was shortly after this that Love took the lamp and went down the cellar steps. He set the lamp on the second of the four steps leading down and peered through the steps into the back part of the cellar, exclaiming: "My God! there she is!" and rushed upstairs and over to Collinson's.

It was after the visit to Collinson's and before the two Collinsons, Kennedy and Hemphill, came that the boy received his instructions from the father and arranged the story about the strange man.
