Fig Pudding.

Break five slices of bread into one pint of milk, add one-half of a teaspoonful salt, one-half of a cupful of sugar, one cupful of suet, three tablespoonfuls of flour, three eggs, one-half of a grated nutmeg, and 16 figs chopped fine. Pour into a mold and steam 3 1/2 hours. Serve with a fruit sauce or with whipped cream.

Corned Beef Hash.

Two bowls of corned beef, four bowls of boiled potatoes chopped fine, a dash of pepper. Grease a baking dish; put the hash in it to moisten with a cup of water. Insert a knife all over the top and put dots of butter in. Bake an hour and a half.

To Clean Brass.
