THE BLACKFEET.— The report given by the "Globe" last Thursday regarding the troubles on the Blackfeet Reserve, at Gleichen, N. W. T., have special interest to this symmetric two voung ladies, Miss Mary Symmetric, and Mrs. Mahood being engaged on that Reserve. The difficulty arose through the death of a child at the school or home maintained by the Mission. The child died of diphtheria, and the mission people were desirous of having the child buried without any Indian ceremonies. Parental affection, strong in every human breast, is strongest with the least reasoning being. If an Indian suspects anyone of having influenced the death of his child, somebody has to be killed. The head of the Mission was Rev. Mr. Tim's, who has been on the Reserve for fifteen years. He was assisted in the education of the Indian children by Mrs. Tims and Miss Symonds. For some little time past, a feeling of hostil-For some little time past, a feeling of hostility has arisen among the Indians towards Mr. Tims, and it was considered advisable for him to leave, which he had done, just previous to the death of the child, accompanied by his wife and Miss Symonds. They went south to the Blood Reserve. The posi tion for a day or two was exceediagly critical. Mr. Hardgeman, the Instructor, with Rev. Mr. and Mrs. Mahood remained on the Reserve, and a recent telegram states that all is now quiet, and no danger anticipated though it will certainly be wise for Mr. Insto find some new and distant field.
