

Nicholas II. of Finland.
 "Very little is so far known about Nicholas II., the new grand duke of Finland," says a correspondent. "There is no doubt that the young czar has received an excellent education. The home life of the imperial family, so touchingly plain, in the atmosphere of which he has grown up, must needs have exercised some influence on his character. In order to develop the ideas in a more liberal direction, and extend his views as to the high duties of a ruler, his gilded teacher, Mr. Heath an Englishman, has not spared any efforts. While travels have tended to ripen his judgment and increase his experience, his feelings towards Finland are understood to be very sympathetic. All this is a good guarantee for the future. The great question remains whether the young emperor will have sufficient independence of character to free himself from the influences of the counselors who have stood at his father's side."

When the doctor and his distinguished guest reached Thirty-sixth street, the one-man wagon halted and was not driven on until the President had ascended the steps and entered Dr. Bryant's residence—New York Mail and Express.
