PRINTER GETS RECALL PETITION

MOVE TO UNSEAT ABERHART GOES FORWARD ANOTHER STEP

EDMONTON, Sept 22—Recall proceedings launched against Premier Aberhart by electors in his Okotoks-High River Constituency went ahead today. Petition forms have been sent to the King's Printer and it was expected they would be mailed to the riding tomorrow.

R. A. Anderson, Clerk of the Executive Council, said sufficient forms will be forwarded to the electors to permit 75 per cent of the electors on the last voter's list to sign the petition about 5,500 signatures. Under the Recall Act, about seven months might elapse before a new member of the Legislature is chosen to succeed the Premier if he were unseated.
