BRAKEMAN SLIPPED AND FELL UNDER A CAR OF COURN.

Mr. James Storer, sworn, said: "I am a locomotive foreman of the Lindsay shops; don't know anything personally about the accident. The couplings on the cars mentioned are automatic and would have coupled all right if the link and pin had been out of the way; no person was to blame for the link and pin being there, as they were needed to couple up with the cars... The jury were then asked to return a verdict, Coroner Poole stating there did not appear from the evidence to have been any culpable negligence on the part of anyone. The finding was as follows: "That said William Higgs, deceased, came to his death in the town of Lindsay on the evening of Friday, Feb. 8, 1899, at 5.15 o'clock, by accidentally falling on the railway track while performing his duties as yardman, a car passing over his body, and so causing death."
