THE TRENT VALLEY CANAL

PETERBORO ANXIOUS TO HAVE THE WORK COMPLETED.

At a meeting of Peterboro citizens held on Thursday, Jan. 26th, Trent Vallay Canal matters were very fully discussed. Mr. Carnegia made a very interesting address in support of a speedy completion of the canal, from which we make the following extracts.

With regard to the resources and requirements of this large districts Mr. Boyd, of Bobcaygeon, estimated that from two to four million tons of forest products alone can be taken from each of some dozen of townships were this outlet provided for their transport, and the taking out and manufacture of which would call for the employment of an immense amount of labor for years to come.

The late Mr. Rathbun, of Deseronto, expressed the opinion that if the work can be accomplished for an expenditure of \$10,000,000 it would not be a bad investment for the general interests of the country; that it would be a cheap way of getting coal back through the district; that it would regulate to a certain extent the freight charges on all the grain raised through the section that it would open up a large field for individual enterprise in a small way; and that it would attract great numbers of tourists from the other side, who would make use of it as a means of getting to the back lakes with yachts, pleasure boats, etc., who would, before many years, expend hundreds of thousands of dollars in the country every year; that there is not now and never will be accessible to railways, and that in his opinion the canal will bring more facilities for transportation to a larger area of country than would be the case if the same amount that would be required for the completion of the canal were expended in extending the railways no matter where you might locate them. He also attaches great importance to the influence which the canal would exert as a government work in regulating the freights-there being periods or occasions when all the means of transportation combined are insufficient to meet the demands. And to which Mr. Rathbun might have added that at such times non-competing points have always to stand aside until the competing points are served. Here too, in this district along the

shores of this waterway we have the county towns of Peterborough, Lindsay and Barrie, the towns of Port Perry and Orillia, and the incorporated villages of Hastings, Ashburnham, Lakefield, Bobcaygeon, Fenelon Falls, Beaverton and Holland Landing, and all of which will have water communitwo divisions now under way are completed, a line of water communication of about 180 miles in length, which only requires the construction of about eleven miles of canal and the canalization of about eight miles of river to give it connections with Montreal, and the construction of about another 13 1/2 miles of canal to complete it to the Georgian Bay. What such a connection with Montreal would mean to the people of the whole district and more than three times what it does manufacturing interests may be imagined when it is stated that it now costs fifty per cent more to carry a bushel of wheat from any of our county towns to Montreal than it does from Chicago to the same point, and more than three times what it deso from Buffalo to points on the canal or to New York; that in 1897 coarse frieghts were carried from New York to Buffalo and intermediate points at from 40c. to 70c. per ton, and general merchandise at from 50c. to \$1 per ton, while it now costs \$2 a ton to get pig iron from Montreal to Peterborough. As for the Toronto-Georgian Bay scheme it is very nearly on a par with the one last mentioned.
