THE CARRIAGE-MAKING INDUSTRY

Mr. Kyle said he wished to give a brief resume of the carriage-making industry for the past 25 years. A quarter of a century ago there were from one to four carriage and wagon shops in every village and town in Ontario. Some years ago the Gananoque Co. began manufacturing on wholesale lines, and others followed. There was no shipping to foreign points then, so the firms made a dead set against the small manufacturers, with fatal results. Lindsay makers had been able to withstand the onslaught better than those of most towns, but the competition has been fiercer. At the present time the town factories employ about 50 hands, with a payroll of \$25,000. How long present conditions will endure are not venture to guess, most of the American wholesale manufacturers have become wealthy, and the reason given by them is the opening up of new territories. The point he wished to make was that our own North-West should to-day be to Ontario manufacturers what the Western and Eastern States have been to American wholesale manufacturers. The Gananoque firm has prospered, and to-day employs 225 men. McLaughlin, of Oshawa, was doing a small business ten years ago, but obtained more capital, began manufacturing wholesale, and to-day has one of the largest plants under the British flag, employing over 300 men, and having an annual output of over \$450,000. In Ottawa the Tudhoe Carriage Co. has grown from a small affair to one of the largest in Canada, and employs over 200 men.
