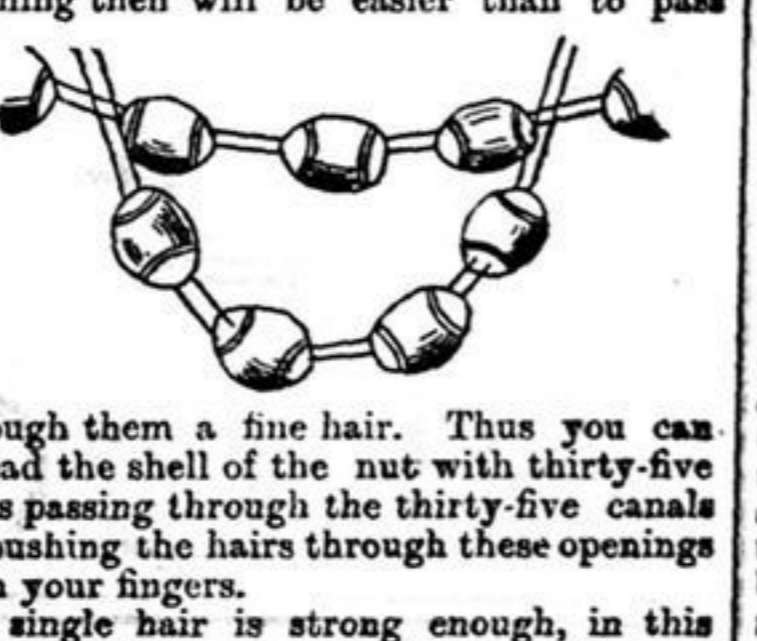
A Necklace of Filberts—How Any Boy or Girl May String the Nutshells Nicely—The Family and the Puzzles—Bright Concepts.
