ECHOES FROM THE CAPITAL. LINDSAY, BOBAYGEON AND PONTYPOOL RAILWAY. An Ottawa despatch in Monday's Empire says: Application will be made to parliament at its present session for an act to revive and amend the act to incorporate the Lindsay, Bobaygeon and Pontypool Railway Company, and to extend the time for commencing and completing the same; also to reduce the capital stock; also to empower to extend the proposed line of railway from Bobaygeon through the township of Galway to a junction with the Ironside, Bancroft and Ottawa railway at Haliburton, in the provincial county of Haliburton.

LIBEL LAW AMENDMENT. A deputation from the Canadian Press Association, consisting of Messrs. King, C. C. Pense and Brerly, waited upon Sir John Thompson on Saturday morning and asked for several important amendments to the law of criminal libel. Among other changes asked, are provisions that no publisher shall be prosecuted in any proceeding, that the privilege attached to public meetings be extended to conform to the British law; that before a newspaper is prosecuted for libel, an affidavit shall be obtained from a judge allowing a husband or wife shall be a competent witness in libel prosecutions; and that a husband or wife shall be a competent witness in libel prosecutions; and that their representations would receive attention.

PORT HOPE. GARDEN HILL TRAGEDY. The post-mortem examination on the body of John McCann was held Tuesday by Dr. Corbett. They found that the deceased had come to his death by a gunshot in his left thigh, which had shattered the thigh bone, severed the arteries of the leg, and scattering the effect of a cranial fracture, causing the fatal hemorrhage. The inquest was held in the town hall, Ballisboro', Tuesday, Dr. Gray, coroner, presiding. Mr. Forsyth was elected foreman of the jury. The medical man who had made the post-mortem examination testified that the deceased came to his death from a fatal hemorrhage. The foreman of the jury asked if medical attendance had been immediately on hand, would it have been possible to have saved the man's life, to which a decided negative answer was returned by the doctors. Thomas McCann was examined. He admitted being drunk at the time of the disturbance at his father's house. He said he went to Forsyth to question him about an evil report he had circulated about him. Forsyth was abusive and used bad words. Rowe came in and they had a little fracas, which was put a stop to by his brother John, who came and persuaded him to go home. They were going home, when Forsyth rushed out and shot John. Rowe and he then attempted to take the gun away from Forsyth, who beat them with the same effect. Forsyth says he fired only in self defence, fearing an attempt would be made to murder him, as he had read that these men had sworn to do him serious harm. No other material evidence was submitted by witnesses. The deceased's ante-mortem statement was read to the jury. Dr. Corbett returned a finding that deceased had come to his death by a shot from a gun in the hands of Thomas Forsyth. The evidence was submitted to the coroner, who will sit on the proceedings against Forsyth at the next assizes. It is probable that it is not likely that the latter will be confined in goal during the interval. Dr. Corbett returned a finding that when they appeared at the inquest, bear any marks of the fight. Forsyth had a slight scratch on his face.
