The Ontario legislature was prorogued Wednesday. Hon. Alexander Mackenzie still lives, but his death is daily expected.

Mr. G. T. Blackstock has declined to accept the nomination of the Toronto young conservatives as a candidate to fill the vacancy in the Ontario house caused by the death of the late H. E. Clarke.

Le Canadien publishes a rumour (which, we fancy, is only a rumour) to the effect that forty Tory members of the house of commons, disapproving of Sir John Thompson's refusal to investigate the charges against Sir Adolphe Caron, have signed a round-robin asking Mr. Edward Blake to assume the leadership of a coalition of which they would form part, with the present members of the opposition.

The Ottawa Free Press says: "It is quite evident that if an investigation of the charges preferred by Mr. Edgar against Sir Adolphe Caron would produce no more serious result than the forced withdrawal of Sir Adolphe from the cabinet, the inquiry would not be refused. But Mr. Abbott and Sir John Thompson seem to be well aware that the investigation asked for by Mr. Edgar would get more important persons than the postmaster-general into trouble."

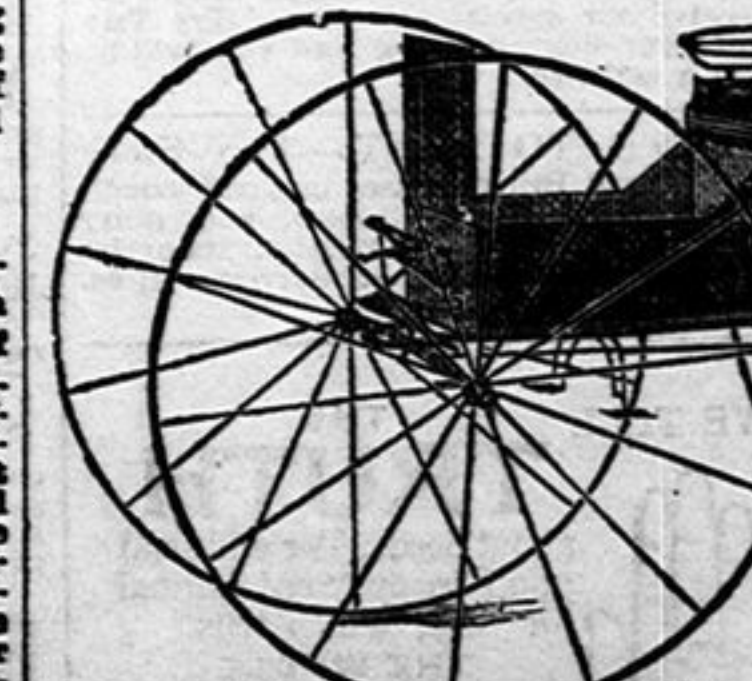
