 The telegraphic despatches announce the death of Mr. James MacCarroll of New York, who died in 1888 and after. Mr. MacCarroll was editor of the Peterboro Chronicle and Despatch. The Boundary Bridges Question.
 The disputes which have existed between the counties of Victoria and Peterborough for the past thirteen years, respecting the maintenance of the Boboyegon bridges, resulting in the passage of the Boboyegon Act in 1878, by which a small portion of the township of Harvey, in Peterborough, was annexed to the township of Verulam in Victoria, and which had the effect of making the county boundary in the middle of Pigeon Lake, as interpreted by the courts, and consequently the whole expense of maintaining the Boboyegon bridges, was thrown upon Victoria. The amendment to the act passed by the legislature at its session just closed provides for the maintenance of the bridges in dispute, and the Pigeon Creek floating bridge, by the two counties. In the event of a dispute as to the proportion each shall pay, the question is to be submitted to arbitration.
