LORD SALISBURY AND TARIFF RETALIATION.

Lord Salisbury's fair trade or tariff retaliation speech is rightly described as the sensation of the week in the old country.

EDITORIAL NOTES. The liberals have scored another victory in North Perth.

Despite the severe condemnation of Hon. Mr. Adams, the conservative member for Northumberland, the Harris land job, by which \$200,000 is to be paid for a piece of land in St. John, N. B., that an official valuation placed at \$50,000, has been rushed through by the ministerial majority.

Salisbury will not have spoken in vain. On more than one occasion Lord Salisbury has squinted towards protection; but he gave about five years ago a pungent and sarcastic sentence to the fair trade fad in a way that will now be quoted against him with effect.

It is understood Hon. Geo. Kirkpatrick will be appointed lieutenant governor of Ontario. This would be a popular appointment.

Prof. Schurman, a Nova Scotian, has been elected president of Cornell university. His career has been remarkably successful.

Sir Alex. Campbell, lieutenant governor of Ontario, died Monday afternoon, in his 71st year. He never recovered from the stroke of paralysis sustained last November, and his death was not unexpected.

The postal revenue at Laurier is \$433 a year, but the Abbott-Quimet government has decided to give the village a \$10,000 post office.

Attorney-General Casgrain has laid a new criminal information against ex-Premier Mercer for alleged malfeasance in office on three different points, viz., receiving and retaining moneys out of the subsidies voted by parliament to the Sais de Chaleurs railway, the Hereford railway and the Ottawa Colonization railway.

The Ottawa Free Press says: "Having failed to obtain a judgment against Mr. Pasquet for the \$100,000 which he received from Mr. Armstrong, the Quebec government should now bring suits against Messrs. Robitaille, Riopel & Co., its own friends, whose certificate as to the bona fide character of the Armstrong claim was in connection with the Behring sea fisheries question."

Lindsay was the subject of illustration in Saturday's Globe, and it made a display equalled by few and surpassed by no other town in the province.

The Montreal Witness says: "A singular blasphemy disgraced the house of commons towards the close of the all-night sitting of Thursday night and Friday morning."

The Globe alluding to the honor conferred on Mr. Mowat, says: "The honor has been accepted by the Premier under the advice of his colleagues, or such of them as he was able to confer with in council when he learned what was contemplated."

The French members are said to be feeling very keenly the bad box in which they have been placed. They are bearing the odium of these revelations resulting from the investigation of last session.
