IN LORD ROSEBERY'S OPINION.

The British Premier Speaks at a Gathering in London-A Well Fosted Correspondent Considers the Situation Very Grave Between Russla and Japan,

London, May 6. -At the annual banquet of the Royal Academy on Saturday evening Lord Rosebery in the course of a nonpolitical speech, referred to the old Eastern question as one "we have always endeavored to lull to rest as something too portentous for imagination." "But now," he continued, "there is the new Eastern question superadded, which I confess, to my apprehension, is in the dim

vistas of futurity infinitely graver."

Substance of Japan's Reply. New York, May 6.—The World has a cable from Tokio, Japan, saying Japan's reply to the protest of Russia, France and Germany against taking from China the Liu-Tong peninsula is, in substance, this: When China ratifles the treaty of peace signed at Shimonoseki, Japan will renounce possession of the province of Manchuria, except the part of the Liu-Tong peninsula extending from Port Arthur to Talien. In recompense for the giving back of this Chinese territory Japan will ask a largely increased indemnity. The response to the three European powers is awaited.

All reports of Japan's reply inconsistent with the foregoing are false. A Correspondent's View.

The words of Sir Charles Dilke to the World correspondent, that the relations between Japan and Russia could not be more strained short of actual war, exactly express the feeling among the responsible leaders of both parties in England.

Russia Talks of War. 3200 Paris, May 6.-The St Petersburg correspondent of the Temps says that Japan, in her reply to the joint protest, consented to abandon Liu-Tong, excepting Port Arthur. The protesting powers have not reached an agreement regarding the reply, the correspondent asserts, and the exchanges of opinion continue. The European edition of the New York Herald learns from its Berlin correspondent that Russia has informed Germany she will declare war in case Japan insists upon the Shimonoseki treaty. No palace building was offered them. Not many of the members of the royal family are at present stopping in London and there are palaces vacant.

VERDICT OF ACQUITTAL Brought in by the Jury After Two Hours of Deliberation-Evidence Given as to
