Boville and Barker in Hamilton. Hamilton, May 20.—(Special)—Four or five hundred men were closely packed in Arcade Hall to-night, when the Conservative Convention for the nomination of candidates for the coming election took place.

An Opponent for Mr. Edgar. Stouffville, May 20.—A Convention of Liberal-Conservatives took place here to-day to nominate a candidate for West Ontario. Mr. Woodcock, barrister, Newmarket; Col. N. F. Paterson, barrister, Uxbridge; Dr. Hunter, Leamington; Robert Miller, Brougham; Arthur Johnston, Greenwood; William McCormack, Toronto; and Mr. Poucher, of Brougham, were nominated.

Dr. McMillan for South Huron. Brucefield, May 20.—A convention for choosing a candidate in the Reform interest for South Huron was held here to-day. There was a very large turnout.

Mr. Corby in West Hastings. Belleville, May 20.—The Liberal-Conservative convention held here this afternoon unanimously nominated Mr. Harry Corby, ex-M.P., as their candidate for West Hastings.

To Oppose Hon. Dr. Montague. Cayuga, May 20.—At the Liberal-Conservative Convention here to-day Mr. Adam A. Davis was nominated to oppose Hon. Dr. Montague in Haldimand and Monck.

It is estimated that 8000 persons were killed at Coria, of which number nearly 9000 perished while seeking refuge in the cathedral, which was set on fire by the Turks.
