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"Nemo me impune lacessit" The Motto of the Lindsay Board of Education. WHEN CHARGED BY COUNSELLORS WITH EXTRAVAGANCE.

Tuesday Night's Meeting of the Board Very Interesting—A Town Council Deputation Receive a Courteous but Effective "Dressing Down"—Communications, Reports and Other Business.

As a result of several past lessons administered during the past few years members of council who give expression to or prefer charges of extravagance against the school board will no doubt become convinced, if not of their foolishness, at least of the wisdom of furnishing such facts and figures as will convince the public that there is something reasonable in their contention.

Principal Hartstone reported 290 pupils on the roll for April, an average attendance of 198, and \$211.15 collected in fees. His report directed the attention of the board to the very low average, and suggested as a remedy that the fees should be collected monthly, his by the term instead of quarterly.

Mr. STEWART said he had given notice about a year ago of his intention to introduce a motion relating with the matter, but was prevented by absence, and had afterwards received a little encouragement, but he had abandoned the idea.

Mr. STEWART read a draft of the motion proposed, and believing that a recital of the facts of the case would be of advantage to some one who might be similarly suffering, I asked permission to make them known, which was readily granted.

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
