The best price that can be obtained in the United for Canada fleece now is 27c. The duty is 12c, the freight charges 0.55 of a dollar, the consular charges 0.25, and the contmission for selling on the other side of the line at 1 1-2 cents per pound, which makes a total of 14.30 per pound for charges after the wool is purchased here. This would leave for the purchaser of the wool in Canada, reckoning on a sale at 27c in the United States, 12 3-4c per pound, and that price leaves no margin of profit for exporters. So much for washed fleece.
