CLEVELAND NOMINATED. It has been a walk-over for Cleveland. The Hill "boom," that threatened some months ago to sweep all before it, completely collapsed. It fairly wilted the first day at Chicago; and the Tammany braves not only found that there was no chance for their scheming candidate but that their only hope was to swim with the strong and steady Cleveland current.

A despatch via C. P. R. line says Cleveland was nominated on the first ballot at 4 o'clock Thursday morning.

MR. BLAKE ACCEPTS. Mr. Blake has given out for publication the following statement which is practically an acceptance of the invitation to take a seat in the imperial parliament.

Mr. Blake's acceptance has occasioned general and heart-felt expressions of regret, but there is at the same time very general approval of the course he has decided to take. It is felt that with his great ability and his wide experience of the working of federal institutions, he will at once take a commanding position in the imperial house of commons, and render invaluable assistance in dealing with the questions that confront the statesmen of the motherland.

We notice in some of the tory papers certain comments on Mr. Blake's so-called "failure" in Canadian politics since he became the leader of the reform party. He failed, it is true, to turn Sir John Macdonald out of power because Sir John supplemented with the gerrymander the enormous influence of patronage and public expenditures corruptly employed.

EDITORIAL NOTES. The suppressed reports of the British farmer delegates, Messrs. McQueen and Danby, which have been brought down in manuscript to the house of commons, state that they had come to the conclusion that free trade with the United States was desirable.

The Bobsayon Independent says: "A Peterboro delegation went to Ottawa last week to ask for a bonus to their Lake Ontario and Seale Lake. Marie Line. They wanted a grant for a piece of the line, the piece to be between old Mrs. Swanton in Ashburham and Charlie Way in Glamorgan, with a few spur lines in Glamorgan, at intervals, one of them being to this village. Fancy a spur line to Bobsayon from Buckhorn Pine Lake main road! Such a spur-line attempt at a railway scheme is horrid, even for Peterboro."
