Your committee have considered the reports of the inspectors of schools for East and West Victoria respectively, and would recommend that they be printed in the minutes of the council. These reports are very satisfactory to your committee, and are so important and valuable as to be entitled to the careful perusal of all who are interested in public education.

Your committee recommend that the additional expenses which may be incurred by reason of the public school leaving examinations being held at the same time as the entrance examinations be paid by the county.


