In other words, one man could get a pail-full and distribute it among those who sent him for it, but they who sent him were not to get their share in a glass if they asked for it in the first instance.

What follows next? Mr. Mowat refers to the supreme court the question of provincial rights on the subject of prohibition, and adds, if the province has the power, and it is so decided, he will at once introduce prohibitory legislation.
