REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION. On motion of Dr. WOOD, seconded by Mr. McDONALD, the report of the standing committee on education was read and adopted without amendments as follows: Your committee recommend that the account of Messrs. Wilson & Wilson for printing for inspectors, amounting to \$3, be paid.

MOVED BY MR. SHAYER, seconded by Mr. ADAM, that the memorial to his excellency the governor-general of the Dominion of Canada in council in reference to claims of parties for damages for accidents being tried by arbitration, be received and read.—Carried.

THE COUNTY RATES. Moved by Mr. LOWNSBROUGH, seconded by Mr. SHAYER, that a by-law be passed for the levying and collecting of certain rates and assessments for county and other purposes in the county of Victoria in the year 1895, be now read a first time.—Carried.

REPORT OF THE COUNTY PROPERTY COMMITTEE. Moved by Mr. CRANDELL, seconded by Mr. ROBSON, that the report of the standing committee on county property be received and read a first time.—Carried.

THE COUNCIL WENT INTO COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE, with Mr. REID in the chair. The report was adopted without amendments as follows: Your committee beg to recommend that the following accounts be paid by the council: John Harley, wood, Court House, \$19.50; Joseph Maunder, wood, Court House, \$12.00; James Keith, grass seed, \$3.00; J. Turner & Co., repairing gas, \$5.00; James Smith & Co., repairing water pipes, \$3.34; Victoria Electric Light Co., extending lighting appliances, Registry Office, \$1.00; Victoria Electric Light Co., lighting Court House, \$1.70; Hour 4 months, \$21.61; Victoria Electric Light Co., lighting gas 4 mos 21 Cts; Victoria Electric Light Co., lighting Registry Office 4 months, \$4.13.
