Deathlock Broken.

Blanco Not Vanquished.

Montreal, June 10.—Senior Bonilla y
Martel, the Spanish Consul-General, has
received the following despatch from
General Blanco, Captain-General of Cuba:
"I have the honor to inform you that the
British and American troops were
completely defeated. During the battle
of Sancti Spiritus, 1,500 soldiers were
killed and 1,000 wounded. The damage
done was slight and the enemy were un-
able to silence a single one of our guns,
and when the enemy's fleet retired it
was plainly seen that several of their
ships had sustained considerable damage.
Our losses are: Killed, the second in
command of the Reina Mercedes, five
sailors and a soldier. We also had two
wounded. (Signed) Blanco."

KEEN FIGHT WITH THE SENATE.

The Amendments of the Upper House
Thrown Out After a Spirited Debate
by the Commons—Prospects That
Sir Mackenzie Bowell Will
Back Down—Closing
Arrangements.

Ottawa, June 10.—The Government
having decided to strike out the amend-
ments to the Franchise bill, and to return
to the Upper Chamber for ap-
proval, means that a direct conflict on
a clear issue will be the result between the
Upper and Lower House, or the Senate
will allow the bill to go through.
It will be seen how the Government and the House
of Commons need have no quarrel over
the fighting ground as has been laid down
by the Senate, but the general opinion
is that Sir Mackenzie Bowell and his
allies will back down and allow the bill
to go through as amended by the Com-
mons. If they don't, the Plebiscite bill is
also killed, as it provides that the vote
will be taken on the Franchise bill, and
