THE LATE CAMPAIGN IN EASTERN ONTARIO.

The Good Work Done by Sir Richard Dunsford and Mr. John A. Barron, Q. C.

Mr. Barron, who has just returned from taking part in the election in Algoma, was in his office Monday for the first time for many weeks, during all which time he was busily engaged in the campaign, more particularly from Toronto east. Questioned by a Post reporter, he gave great credit to Sir Richard Cartwright for the remarkable change in Eastern Ontario. The skill and tact in forging ahead in one race, and going east in another, and striking just when the iron was hot, resulted in the liberal forces being marshalled to the best advantage. Though there were errors in riding, they were generally the result of an accident over which Sir Richard had no control until too late. The election courts will be asked to open such ridings, with a further increase in the splendid achievement in Eastern Ontario. "We went into the fight," said Mr. Barron, "with only five seats between Toronto and Mr. Foster's Frontenac and Prince Edward county, with 18, and I think," said he with a smile, "you will find Mr. Barron and Mr. Foster both on the ground." Mr. Barron said he knew practically nothing about Ontario West, except that its result was a greater disappointment because so much was expected from the liberal end of the province. On all the ridings, he said, South Victoria seemed to be most in the public eye, and Mr. McHugh's victory was an intense satisfaction, as does that of Mr. Hurley's in East Hastings, for they both signify the triumph of tolerance over intolerance. We were all so very confident of North Victoria that losing it was, on that account, a greater disappointment. The result can be chiefly traced in the Ontario confidence, which is so often fatal, is our doubt if we did not get a better result. An application for a recount will be made at once, and the ruling of Judge McDougall, if followed, will give Mr. Graham all the ridings he has been seeking. Mr. Barron, "to hear the torrid professing a scare at French domination, when they batted their heads with remedial legislation to catch the Catholic vote in Quebec. There might have been danger had the province gone for Tupper, for then it clearly would have been a bad day for the Liberal party. We have the free and uninfused vote of Quebec, a vote which resisted church managements and refused to be bought, and from such a people, giving their vote, only good to the whole can result."
