COMMERCIAL NEWS.

Office of THE CANADIAN POST, LINDSAY, AUG. 13, 1891. Sunday's rain was followed by almost uninterrupted fine weather, and great progress has been made in harvesting. It is grand work this year, as the results will be far ahead of last year, and farmers are in splendid spirits. The rain of Sunday has benefited roots and pastures. A business revival and a fine fall and winter trade may be looked for with confidence. A Vienna dispatch says: "Bad weather is spilling the crops in many districts in Austria and Hungary. It is impossible to harvest on account of continuous rain. A hurricane yesterday in Lower Austria, Moravia and Upper Hungary destroyed the season's vintage. In the Gumpoldsdorf district, many of the rivers have overflowed and the adjacent country for miles is inundated. Several persons have been killed by falling trees and houses."
