NEWS OF THE WEEK. HOME AND FOREIGN ITEMS OF INTEREST.

Frederick Strasser of Sparta was stung on the neck near the jugular vein, by two bees, and died within an hour. At Shelbyville, Ind., last Sunday night a man named Hawkins shot and killed a woman...

The entire front of the Taylor building, New York, collapsed on Saturday owing to a mysterious explosion. About 50 people were killed and many were injured. The loss to property was \$300,000.

The Berlin Taptakt says England's interest lies on the side of defeat the draft should France and Russia are suppressed and the immediate consequence would be the expulsion of England from Egypt.

A little rebellion broke out last week in Nicaragua, in which the chief of police and six men were killed, but owing to the prompt measures taken by the government the rioting was suppressed and the ringleaders were arrested.

A contagious disease in cattle broke out in a herd belonging to a farmer living out at Westwood, near Keena, a couple of weeks ago, when Dr. Johnston was called in, and an examination he called in Dr. Fisher was of the opinion that the disease was a form of anthrax or splenic apoplexy, a very contagious disease, usually seen in the months of August and September...

A Berlin cable says: The exportation of rye from Russia to Germany goes on with feverish haste. Between 300 and 400 arrived at Wierbaden Friday and are waiting to transfer their contents to German wagons.

A London cable says: The stories of misery received from Russia are almost incredible. In Besanarab parents are actually offering their children for sale in order to buy food, and dealers at Constantinople are hearing of this purchased through agents in the Russian villages a considerable number of female children, many deaths have resulted from famine, and families are being actually dying in the deepest misery.
