Sowing Clover Seed. Upon farming land that is cultivated

by crop rotation clover should be sown if it is practicable to do so. For enriching the soil red clover is no doubt one of the best leguminous plants, as it grows rank and sends its roots down deep into the soil. However, where a permanent pasture or meadow is desired, timothy should be sown with clover at the rate of four quarts of timothy to son wholly timothy. For the benefit to the soil the next season after seeding wholly with clover, if of the medium does not enrich the soil like red clover. Alfalfa will be the best for dry climates, says The American Agriculturist.

About Cutworms.

Professor McCarthy recommends "for destroying the worms the best method is to prepare loosely tied balls of fresh clover or cabbage leaves moistened with a paste of paris green or white arsenic and flour. Place these balls about 20 feet apart throughout the field" before setting out your plants. The worms will come to them and eat and die.
