

Woman Found Starving in Riverside Park -Two Men, a Woman and Three Childe ren Nearly Famished - Suicides.

New York, Sept. 15.-The never-ending story of human misery in and about a great city was written for public perusal in many ways yester-

It was stamped upon the wan features of Jennie Plovencher, found starving by a policeman in Riverside Park. For five days she had been without food, save a bowl of bread and milk given by a kind-hearted colored woman. Without friends, money or employment she had wandered the streets until she swooned from sheer exhaustion. She is in the Harlem Hos-

They were from Pennsylvania, and had been two weeks tramping to New York, and when found had been three days without anything to eat. 


