So whether in dungeon gloom, or the bewildering danger of shipwreck, his soul was berne up by thoughts and experiences in his inward being that made the external circumstances seem but trivial The evening sermon was also from Philippians, Paul's advice in 4: 2. to nobility of thought being the subject. Everyone knows how frequently unworthy thoughts crowd themselves into our brain, even in the midst of good surroundinge. If we find we cannot rid curselves of them by our own will-power, we should appeal to our God in prayer for his help in expelling them, and he can and will answer the cry of a heart that wants to get rid of the taint of wrong thought. Thought is the parent of action and if we allow ourselves to think in a certain channel, our actions will trend in the same direction. If we put the worst construction on a person's words or deeds we will treat them accordingly; if we think dishonest things we will act dishonestly; if we are unjust in our opinions and judge without due con-sideration we will often imagine innocent Shorey's Ciothing.
