AFRIDS ARE STRONG

General Lockhart Decides on a Postponement. REBELS IN A FORTIFIED POSITION. They Hold a Rugged Plateau From Which it Will be Difficult to Dislodge Them.

Simla, Sept. 24.—Owing to the protracted campaign against the Mohmands, General Sir William Lockhart, commander of the Punjab frontier force, has decided to postpone the general advance against the Afridis.

According to intelligence received from Samana, an advance body of over 2,000 of the enemy has arrived in the Khanki valley, and is watching the movements of the British forces.

It is believed that the capture of the village and the flight of the priest will break the back of the Ahris and assist the British to the further advance of the British.
