NEWS OF THE WEEK.
HOME AND FOREIGN ITEMS OF INTEREST.

Gathered from the Telegraph and Exchanges.
—Herr Koestler of Austria, has invented an electric engine which he claims will travel 123 miles an hour.

—Robbers secured \$25,000 in cash from the residence of Capt. Edgar Whelan at Tuckasho, N. J. last night.

—A London despatch says the report that Lord Rosebery is engaged to marry Frances Victoria, second daughter of the Prince of Wales, is unfounded.

—The Canadian schooner Neelin is high and dry on Manitowish island, having been driven on in last Thursday's gale.

—A man named George W. Wright, a Frenchman, will begin a fifty day fast in Cleveland on December 1st, under the auspices of the Western Reserve university medical college.

—Frank Phillips, a noted desperado of Pike county, Ky., who is reported to have murdered a score of men in his time, was killed in a mine on Friday near Charleston, West Virginia.

—A Pacific Mail steamer says that his line has already carried 5,000,000 bushels of grain from Manitoba and the North-west this season against 2,300,000 bushels last year.

—A portion of Gen. Benedict Arnold's flagstaff, sunk in October, 1779, in Lake Champlain, has been raised by Capt. C. W. Adams, of West Addison, Vt. The timbers are of oak and are sound.

—President Van Horn of the C. P. R. while in Winnipeg this week confirmed the statement that a fast at Antioch will be established by that company, and stated that a line to Australia is also contemplated.

—In the celebrated divorce case of Russell against Russell at Victoria B. C., the court has granted a judicial separation. The wife was only 15 years of age at the time of her marriage, while her husband was 50.

—The Duchess of Marlborough will receive the \$1,000,000 on the duke's life. He had taken out policies in this large amount as a result of the late duke's sums the duchess has expended in repairing and beautifying Blenheim palace.

—The hole in the ground on Silver Mountain, Idaho, for which an English syndicate paid \$1,000,000 for the exclusive rights, is being worked by mining experts. It was cleverly "salted" by Matt Graham, the former owner, before the sale.

—Between one hundred and fifty and two hundred sets of ivory billiard balls, valued at \$150,000, were stolen from the G. A. Akam Manufacturing Co. Chicago, on Saturday night, during the democratic ratification. The thieves carried away the plunder with the aid of several confederates.

—The steamer Canadian, at Glasgow from Baltimore, reports that the most fearful weather prevailed during her passage. Tremendous seas broke over her and Capt. Goodwin was blown from the deck and fell into the sea. She remained in this position for eighty hours. Fifty head of cattle were lost.

—A man residing near Newport, Ind., met a horrible death Monday night. He was subject to epileptic fits. About 9 o'clock he went out to feed the hogs. As he did not return one of the family went out to see what was the matter and found the hogs were tearing the old man's body to pieces.

—While one of the officials at the railway station at River DuLoup was counting his money at Friday night preparatory to sending it away, a man wearing a military uniform, struck him a violent blow in the face, knocking him down and stunning him. The stranger then fled with his escape worth about \$100 and he still at liberty.

—"Al" Smith of New York, whose fame as a sporting man is international, made the greatest play of his life this week against a furgo bank. He won \$200,000 in one night—a record which is not satisfied. In the gambling centers last night all the sports were talking about "Al's" great play and speculating as to when he would stop.

—An exciting prevalence at Truro, N. S., just now in consequence of a big discovery of gold at the Caribou mines, worked by the Truro gold mining company about thirty miles from Truro. The news of the discovery has aroused anything yet discovered in Nova Scotia, and is expected to turn out the biggest and richest gold mine ever opened in Canada.

—A Montreal carter named Julien Lafrenay was driving along the Beaver line wharf the other day when a barrel fell from a wagon that was proceeding in front of him. This barrel burst on the face of the carter, who was struck on the forehead by the sound came back to the face of Lafrenay, who was almost suffocated by the powder. He was allowed quite a quantity and soon felt the symptoms of poisoning. He was taken to his home, where a priest and a doctor were summoned, and it was only some time after that the powerful remedies administered acted and saved his life.

—Capt. Quinn, of the schooner, Pearl Nelson, which arrived at Provincetown, Mass., on Friday, partially disabled, reports colliding with an iceberg in a dense fog off Labrador. The schooner ran aground on the berg, which was 200 feet high. The captain says all his men except one, who was at the time too frightened to move, took to the boats and deserted him and his vessel. There was a strong current setting past the berg which enabled him to get the vessel off. The captain and his one man then tried to make sail, and the noise of the blocks was heard by the runaway crew, who were by the sound came back to the vessel and got aboard. —A Paris despatch says: The French steamer John Holly with a cargo of dynamite, was on the coast of Newfoundland, when it was intended for the Dominican army. The vessel was seized and her cargo confiscated. —Geo. Dodds has telegraphed the details of the shooting that preceded the capture of Capt. On Nov. 4, the village of Duxru, in which the king has a large palace, was carried by assault. The Dominicans fought desperately. They were commanded by the king in person, and any show of cowardice was punished by instant death. Six of the French were killed and forty-five wounded. The French falling into an ambush.
