Richard, lookout; Henry Thompson, lookout; Conrad Blanke, fireman; William Gregory, fireman; George H. Brown, second steward; Frederick Moffitt, oiler; Edward Smith, deckhand, Rochester; M. Bell, deckhand.

THE TWO SURVIVORS. The names of the two men saved are: Louis Laforee, Jr., second mate; William Gill, a deckhand living at 137 Kent-st., Rochester, N. Y. ST. JOHN AND HALIFAX. Both Sailed with the Freight and Mail Boat - Millions for the North-west.

Montreal, Nov. 7.—(Special)—While St. John will have the heavy freight landed on her docks Halifax will receive the mails. Mr. D. W. Campbell, manager of the Beaver Line, returned from a tour to-day. He states that the matter was discussed with all parties, including the Canadian Pacific Railway, are now satisfied.
