Napanee, Ont., Nov. 13.—News has just reached here of the accidental shooting of Charlie Trimble at Johannesburg South Africa, on the 5th of last month. He was fatally wounded by his revolver falling from his belt and exploding. He left here about seven years ago and was connected with one of the largest firms of Johannesburg. He was about 26 years of age. Mr. Richard Trimble of Toronto is his eldest brother.

Grand Trunk Make Concessions to Freight Crews. INTERIM REPORT PRESENTED.

Discussion of Schedule of Wages for Conductors and Brakemen—Men to be Un-derstand That Decision Has Been Given a Favor of Freight Train Crews. Toronto, Nov. 11.—A meeting of the Executive of the Toronto branch of the Brotherhood of Trainmen was held yesterday, when an interim report was presented by one of the eight delegates who from this city to Montreal to discuss with the Grand Trunk management the new schedule of wages which the latter proposes to adopt in the case of conductors and brakemen on way freight trains.
