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DEBILITY THE LEGISLATOR A Brilliant Ceremony Promised for This Afternoon.

THE FATHER OF THE HOUSE. The Governor-General and the Countess Aberdeen to be Present—Arrangements for the Opening by the New Lieutenant-Governor, Sir Oliver Mowat—Cere-Monial Detail.

Toronto, Nov. 30.—On account of the presence of the Governor-General and the Countess Aberdeen to be present at the opening of the Ontario Legislature this afternoon is to be a more imposing nature than is usual, in addition to the contingent of the Royal Regiment of Canadian Infantry...

Lord and Lady Aberdeen will occupy two great gilded chairs, to be placed on a raised platform, taking up the space usually occupied by the desks of the Attorney-General and the Minister of Education...

On Wednesday, Mr. W. M. German, member of Parliament, will move the address in reply to the speech from the throne; Mr. C. F. Farwell, from the 500, will second the address, and Mr. W. H. Willoughby, from the Opposition, will lead off the debate on the speech, and the Attorney-General will follow.

The speech from the throne, to be read by Lieut.-Gov. Sir Oliver Mowat, allusion is made to the visit of their Excellencies Lord and Lady Aberdeen to the capital of the Province.

The reason for calling the Legislature together has been a matter of importance in certain quarters, and it is generally supposed that the Cabinet, having decided to take the advice of the Legislature as to the advisability of adopting new regulations with respect to the progress of the session, has had in mind to get out of logs, there really need be no mystery in the matter.

WHAT GERMANY WILL TAKE. Missionaries Must be Punished and a Big Indemnity Paid. London, Nov. 27.—A special dispatch received here from Shanghai says that Baron von Heyking, the German Minister to China, has presented to the Chinese government the demands of Germany for the recent murder of German missionaries and the destruction of German mission property.

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PROFIT IN COLD STORAGE FRUIT. Shipment by Str. Kastaba Shows That New Methods Are Preferable.

London, Nov. 29.—(Telegram cable.)—A cargo of fruit from Canada arrived by the steamer Kastaba to-day. Mr. Crandall, the Canadian Government agent, has made a close study of Canadian fruit shipments as to the proper mode of packing, etc.

A Seizure in the Thames Which Shows Where the Afridis Got Their Supplies. London, Nov. 30.—Eight barges, loaded with cases of gunpowder, falsey labelled "Arms," have been seized by the customs officers in the Thames. They emanated from Russia, and were about to be sent from Russia, and were about to be transferred to the steamer Baluchistan for the north of Lagos only to be ready for the occupation and organization of the Borgu district, which is expected to be included in the British sphere as a result of the Paris conference.

RUSSIAN DUPLICITY. Canada's Finance Minister Attends a Conference at Manchester. London, Nov. 27.—(Telegram special.)—Hon. W. S. Fielding, Canadian Minister of Finance, after luncheon with the chairman of the canal directors, Manchester, held a conference at the Lord Mayor's office. There was in attendance a representative body of merchants, and the subjects of Canadian trade and insolvency legislation were fully discussed.

"We Must Forestall England." Berlin, Nov. 29.—The presence of Emperor Wilhelms at Kiel upon the occasion of swearing in the naval recruits has had the expected effect of clearing the situation, so far as Germany's attitude towards China and Hayti is concerned. Within two months a squadron of 3500 men, with a Prince Henry of Prussia, brother of His Majesty, is to command half this force, lends probability to the reports current in Government circles that hot work is expected, as Prince Henry's great ambition for years past has been to win naval laurels.
