RECORD OF THE GOVERNMENT.

Brantford, Dec. 4.—An enthusiastic and largely attended Liberal convention for the purpose of nominating a candidate to represent the riding in the Legislature took place in the Weymouth Hall this afternoon.

When the nomination had been agreed to unanimously and enthusiastically the President called upon the Attorney-General, Hon. A. S. Hardy, who was received with tumultuous applause.

Everything the Liberals had done on record, Mr. Whitney claimed that the Government had become frightened and stopped his tour of the country, a tour that was the object of the Opposition said was such a triumph.

THE YUKON DISTRICT.

Lecture by Mr. Wm. Ogilvie, Dominion Surveyor - A Very Rich Canadian Area.

Toronto, Ont., Dec. 6.—Mr. William Ogilvie, Dominion Topographical Surveyor, had by no means an uninterested audience when he delivered his lecture on "The Klondike, or the Canadian Province of the Yukon."

Passing over the various routes of ingress to the Klondike, and the progress in development from the discovery of its wealth in 1870 until the present day, the Dominion Surveyor reverted enthusiastically to that wealth.

He believes there is \$100,000,000 in sight in the district to-day," he said amid applause. This did not include what might be obtained by placer and quartz mining.
