EXTENSIVE ROBBERIES. - One Jacob Williams was detected stealing money from the till of the bar of the "Victoria Hotel," Barrie, on Tuesday. Search brought to light an astonishing amount of larceny. Some \$2,000 worth of coats, pants, socks, shirts, under-clothing generally and jew-elry were recovered. Williams, and a brother charged with connivance. have been committed for trial.

THE following Statistics, showing the astonishing progress of the shipping on the great lakes, are interesting. In 1845, according to the Detroit Free Press, the total number of vessels on the lakes was 380, with an aggregate of 76,000 tons. The construction of these vessels cost Orillia, Feb. 26th, 1873. \$4,000,000. At the close of 1872 the estimated total number of vessels was 5,429, with an aggregate tennage of 717,229 tons, and valued at \$53,000,000. Some idea of the increase of trade indicated by these figures may be formed, when we consider that there are very extensive lines of railway, on both sides of the route, owned by wealthy companies and competing for the traffic.
