TAKE CARE OF YOUR HEALTH.—The warm season is approaching, when epidemic diseases may be expected to take more malignant form and ravage in localities hitherto unaffected. Great care should be taken by all not to induce the irruption of new diseases, nor to increase the virulence of those already existing amongst us, but on the contrary, every effort should be put forth to preserve the public health and prevent the introduction or uprising of dangerous diseases not now afflicting the locality. In the majority of cases, diseases of a contagious or epidemic character may be warded off or their effects greatly moderated by proper attention to domestic and public cleanliness, and due regard to the laws of life. With the increasing heat of the season, places where the filthy accumulations of the winter are heaped up, will become obnoxious to the nostrils and dangerous to the health; and whether these offensive piles are on public or private ground, they ought at once to be removed and necessary steps should be taken to purify the spots with chloride of lime or some other equally effective purifier for the public good. Cellars and outhouses ought to be immediately brought under the most rigid inspection, and all decaying vegetable matter buried or destroyed, and door-yards properly drained, that miasmatic exhalations, likely to come from these places if not attended to, may be prevented and the health of the neighbourhood conserved. "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure," and a great deal of unhappiness and sorrow may be obviated by a little timely and judicious management.
