With the increasing heat of the scason, places where the filthy accumulations of the winter piles are on public or private ground, in ten days. they ought at once to be removed and necessaey steps should be taken to purify the spots with chloride of lime or some other equally effective purifier, for the public good. Cellars and outhonses ought to be immediately brought under the most rigid inspection, and all decaying vegetable matter buried or destroyed, and door-yards properly drained, that miasmatic exhalations, likely to come from these places if not attended to, may be prevented and the health of the neighbourhood conserved. 
