

NOTICE OF MOTION.

Mr. Cook has given notice of motion for an Address for a return of the aggregate sum of money applied to the returning officer for the North Riding of the County of Simcoe during the late elections for the Commons, for the purpose of meeting the expenses of said election and the remuneration of the persons appointed as deputy returning officers, the names of such deputy returning officers in which their several affidavits and the amount of money paid to each deputy returning officer for said services, and all disbursements attendant upon the discharge of his official duties. Also—Enquiry of the Ministry why the Government did not expend the money inserted in the estimates last year for the purpose of improving the harbour of the town of Collingwood, and in asking for a re-vote whether it is the intention of the Government to expend such money to be expended at an early date in the ensuing year, and in the rebuilding of the breakwater and deepening said harbour so as to admit vessels of heavy draught.

The Grand Jury brought in "No Bill" in the libel suit against the Witness. We congratulate our contemporary, and the Press of that Province, upon this verdict.

W. JOHNSON, M. P. for Belfast, Ireland, who was invited to this country by the Orangemen of the Dominion last summer, has availed himself of every opportunity since his return of representing Canada favorably.

The election going on in Prince Edward, and which will probably decide the attitude of that Province towards Confederation, according to late accounts does not give much assurance of success on the part of Mr. Laird and his friends. Local questions injudiciously introduced will probably defeat the Government.

The Orange Incorporation bills passed during the session of the Ontario Legislature just closed, have been reserved for the decision of His Excellency the Governor-General. We can hardly see why these Bills should have been considered as of sufficient importance to necessitate their being so reserved, but no doubt the sanction of His Excellency will be given them.

We need home manufactures, home industry, home enterprise, and the exercise of home talent. We need to furnish a ready market for our farmers, and inducements for men of business and first-class tradesmen and artisans to settle amongst us. All these we need, and all these we can get by encouraging and promoting home manufactures. The questions are: Who will furnish the capital? and the capital furnished what encouragement and assistance will be given?
