Liquor Shops.
Editor of THE EXPOSITOR:
SIR,—I read with pleasure the remarks made by you on the 15th inst. in the Temperance Society in this village. It must be gratifying to your noble Order to see their numbers increasing so rapidly. I trust you will go on prospering. May the day speedily come when the whole of the Temperance Societies in Orillia will not only be heard but felt. The liquor trade now carried on in this village is a disgrace to the place, and it is time it received a check. In this municipality of some two thousand souls, there are some thirty places where liquor can be purchased at five cents a glass. Hotel keepers are required to pay a much higher rate for a licence to sell them to sell by the glass, yet it is a notorious fact that store keepers take out a shop licence which calls that they shall not sell in less quantities than a quart, yet sell a glass to any party willing to pay the cents for it. But this is not the most degrading part of the business. It is a well known fact that merchants use it as a means to entice people to make purchases at their stores. Their motto is, "Buy from us, and get your drinks for nothing." Is it not a shame, a disgrace, that man, God's noblest work, should stoop so low as to hold a cup of poison to his fellow-creatures for the sake of enriching himself, but worse yet to think that a store-keeper in our beautiful village would offer the intoxicating cup to "woman" the pride of the earth, yet it is almost a daily occurrence; their greed for gain is such that they make themselves no better than the serpent. I have often wondered if mothers when approached by these serpents in human form, glass in hand, did not think of their higher nature, their children, the example they were setting those loved ones. Kind in their, don such wicked motives, and tempt you to dash the wine cup in your tempter's face. Some may think it pleasant to trade with those generous men who invite you to drink in their stores; it is not generosity, their liquor cost money, and would not be given away unless they could make money by it. I am sorry to see that so many of our Counsellors are in favour of granting the greater freedom to liquor. Orillia will take this matter into consideration, and use every means in their power to secure the nomination and election of our next municipal election of such men as will do all in their power to put a stop to the wholesale liquor traffic, now carried on in this village, the curse of our glorious Dominion.
