THE report of the Binghampton Asylum for Inebriates for 1872 has just come to hand. It appears that there was paid by the patients or their friends the sum of \$42,346 70, while other sources of income brought up the whole to \$53,537 64. This was all expended except \$445 34. In January, 1872, ther were 85 patients, of whom eighteen were free. During the year 249 were admitted, and of these, 39 were free. The highest price charged for board and care is \$20 per week. If the patient or his friends cannot raise this sum, then the charge is graduated according to the available means; and if there are no means, when there is evidence that it is a fit case for free admission, the patient is admitted. The average price per week has been \$10.
