There are more males than females born by 4 per cent. At the age of 20 there are more more females than males. At the age of 40 the preponderance is again on the other side, and there are more males than femal s. At 70 the sexes are again even. Between 70 and 100 years there are 15,300 more women than men, or an excess of 5 per cent. The mortality of women is greatest between the ages of 20 and 40. After 40 years of age the probabilities of longevity, as is shown, are far greater for females than for males.

Decaisne before the French Academy of Sciences, is as follows: London, 1 in 175 deaths; New York, 1 in 172; Vienna, 1 in 160; while in Paris it has reached the shocking number of 1 in 72.






