CONSIGNMENTS. TO IMMIGRATION AID SOCIETIES.

THE Dominion Government having arranged with the Dominion and Temperley Lines, to bring from the British Isles a limited number of families of Agricultural laborers and domestic servants, at the rate of £2 10s per adult, the Ontario Government will advance the \$60 to each Immigration Aid Society as will avail themselves of these rates to procure the labourers mentioned. By this scheme £1 0s 4d sterling equal to about \$5 10, remains to be provided for each adult.

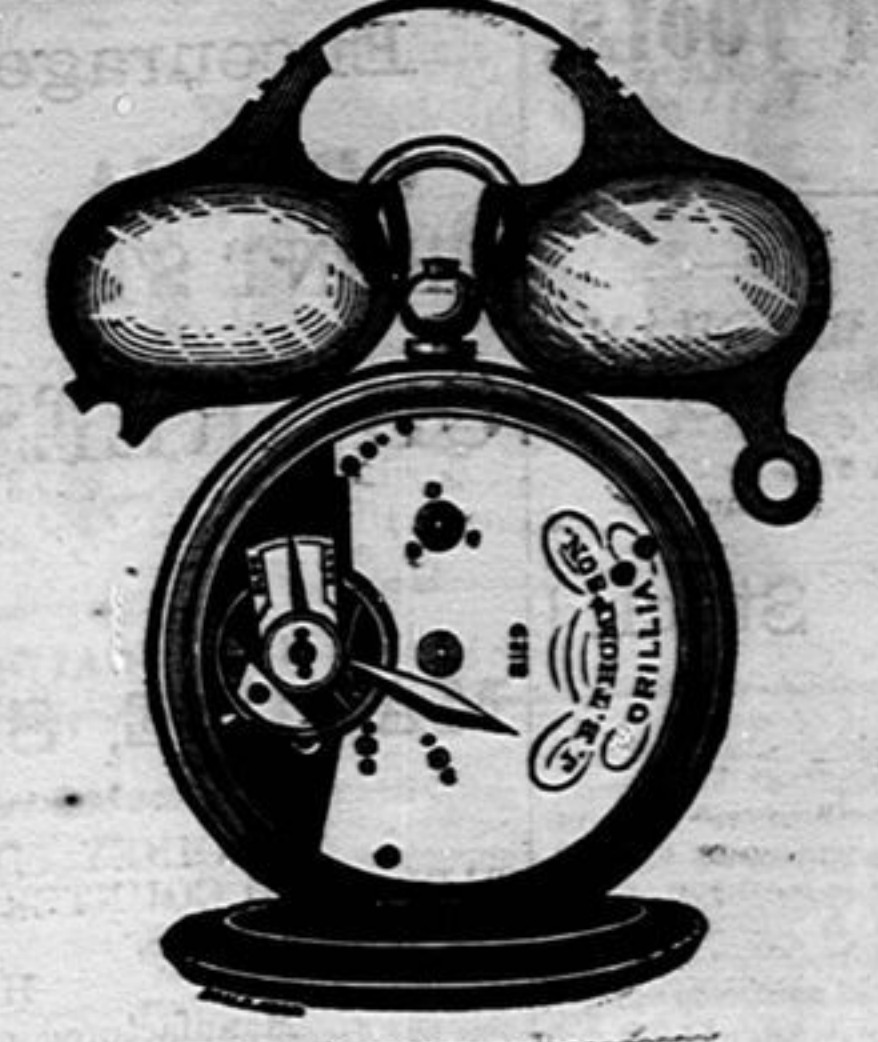
