TO THE ELECTORS

OF THE

COUNTY OF MUSKOKA!

GENTLEMEN,—The recent re-adjustment

of the Electoral Districts of Ontario, based

upon the census of 1871, has resulted in

the formation of a New County for Electoral

purposes, comprising the Districts of

Muskoka, Parry Sound and a portion of

Nipissing.

You will therefore, shortly be called

upon to choose a representative for the

House of Commons, to serve during the

term of the next Parliament.

At the earnest solicitation of nearly all

the leading men of the County, to place

myself in nomination, I now beg to announce

myself a candidate for the high

honour of being your representative, and

to enable you to decide how far I may be

entitled to your confidence and support, I

take the opportunity of briefly stating my

opinions on some of the political questions

likely to come before the public attention.

If elected, I shall be prepared at all

times, to support all good measures, no

matter from what source they may emanate;

and at the same time, I have no hesitation

in saying that I highly disapprove of the

policy of the Dominion Government, in

the management of many important

matters. I might particularly mention the

mis-management and extravagance in the

construction of the Intercolonial Railway,

the Washington Treaty, the refusal to pass an

Election Law similar to that in the Province

of Ontario, for the punishment of corrupt

practices at elections, and for the trial of

controversial elections by the Judges, &c. For

these reasons my views are decidedly in

accord with Her Majesty's Loyal Opposition

at Ottawa.

While it is requisite that the Executive

should have certain discretionary powers,

I hold the opinion that these powers

should be confined to the smallest limit

consistent with the proper administration

of the Government of the country, hence

I stand firmly opposed to placing large

sums of money at the disposal of the

ministry, without the sanction of Parliament

being first obtained to all particulars and

details connected therewith.

I shall give my earnest support to any

measure having for its object the promotion

of EMIGRATION TO CANADA.

I shall give my hearty support to all

legitimate measures or schemes to aid in

the establishment of easy communication

between all parts of the Dominion. It is

my firm conviction that, with the energy

and enterprise of our people properly

directed, and encouraged by wise legislation

and good laws, the day is not far distant

when our Dominion will rank among the

first countries of the Globe, in the extent

and variety of her agricultural and manuf-

acturing products.
