THE PARTY SOUND ADOPTED says a large number of newly arrived immigrants reached this country on Saturday evening, in search of land. We are glad to know that they have taken up lots and are going to settle in the District.

A WARSAW letter in the 'Daily Gazette,' states that during the late stay at Konigsberg, in Prussia, of the Duke Constantine, formerly Governor of Poland, his Imperial Highness declared that the severity of the Russian rule in that country was to be generally relaxed.

It is a report just published of the engineer to the Commissioners of Sewers, it is estimated that the population of London will amount within the next forty years to six millions. It appears, from a table contained in this report, that in East London as many as 170,194 persons were already crowded in each square mile.

THE recently published report of the Postmaster General of Great Britain shows that the number of letters delivered in 1868 was 505,118,000—an increase of 4.29 per cent. over the number in 1867. It exhibits an increase of over 25 per cent. in five years, the number having been 622,000,000 in 1863. The average delivery in 1868 was 26 to each person, and 149 to each house; in England, 30 letters to each person; in Scotland, 24; in Ireland, 10.

SPAIN.—The Government regards the Republican insurrection as ended. Proclamations are issued, calling for the cessation of hostilities. A conspiracy to surrender the barracks at San Mateo de los Rios has been discovered and thwarted. The Captain of the garrison is said to be the leader of the conspiracy. The Opposition has advanced the understanding exists between the insurgents here and in Spain.

THE Hon. Mr. T. J. Spier appears in the 'Gazette' for Saturday.—His Excellency the Governor General takes the earliest opportunity of conveying his thanks, and by special despatch, those of His Royal Highness Prince Arthur, to the officers, non-commissioned officers and men of the Volunteer Militia of the Dominion of Canada, who have recently turned out within the Province of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Quebec.

The 'Northern Light' says the show was a fine turn out, and the working oxen; which cows were good, but deficient in numbers; some of the young cattle were very fine, particularly the young calves and heifers.
