COMPARATIVE EARNINGS.

The Scotsman earns on the average £15 a year, and the Irishman £20. Scotland spends £3 per head per year for upkeep of police, roads, bridges, harbors, education, etc., while the Englishman and Irishman contribute £2 18s. and £1 4s. respectively. LONG-LIVED ANIMALS. The recent presentation to the National History Museum in London of an eagle-owl which has lived 72 years in confinement leads Mr. W. P. Lycraft, the ornithologist, to assemble a number of instances of great age attained by birds. A golden eagle which died in Vienna in 1719 was known to have been in captivity 104 years. A white-headed vulture captured in 1705 died in the Vienna Zoological Gardens in 1821. There is a record of a falcon which lived to the age of 162 years. In comparatively few instances are the stories of great age attained by animals authenticated by trustworthy records.

INSANITY AMONG THE JAPS.

Professor Jacobs found that, while among Englishmen, the number of insane is 3,050 per million, and among Scotchmen 3,400, the number among the Japs equals 3,900. Servi found one lunatic to every 391 Jews in Italy. Mayr states that to each 10,000 Christians in Germany there 8.6 insane, while among the Jews the number reaches 16.1. In Bavaria the proportion is still greater—9.8 among Christians and 25.2 among Jews. Rjansky gives his experience of ten years' practice in a small town, Dagd, with a population made up of 1,014 Jews and 328 Christians. Among the Jews he observed 47 cases of nervous and mental diseases, while, on the other hand, not a single case of mental unbalance occurred among the Christians. There is every reason to believe that the nervous strain under which the Jews have lived and still live in European countries aided by the intensification of pre-disposition by close intermarriage, is accountable for the prevalence of insanity in this race.
