**FIFTH ANNUAL CONVENTION OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOLS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF EMILY**  
HELD IN  
**Christ Church, Omemee,**  
MARCH 16, 1900.

The Convention is a thing of the past, but its influence will no doubt be felt for a long while and everybody looks forward to the next Convention with great expectations of blessings.  
The first session was held on Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock and a very fair attendance was present.  
The proceedings were opened with devotional exercises by the Rev. E. A. Langfeldt. He welcomed the congregation to his Church and hoped that the Convention might prove to be a blessing to every soul. Referring to the 2nd Book of Kings, the 2nd chapter and 9th verse, Mr. Langfeldt hoped that every one had come in the spirit of Elijah's prayer, desiring to receive a double portion of God's Holy Spirit. He trusted that the passage would become the keynote of the Convention.  
After the prayers, the President appointed the Superintendents of the various Sunday Schools the Nominating Committee for the election of Officers.  
The reports of the Sunday schools was the next order of business. It was a matter of great satisfaction and thanksgiving to God, that, throughout, the reports showed the Sunday schools to be in a prosperous and healthy condition. Every school presented an encouraging report and, judging from the faithful work done, the spiritual state of the rising generation in this township ought to be indeed very promising.  
After the singing of a hymn, Rev. R. M. Pope was called upon to address the audience. He explained his inability to choose a subject, as no particular theme had been assigned to him. However, the speaker in his address gave some very helpful and instructive hints on the education of the young. He regretted that the Sunday school scholars did not receive sufficient knowledge of the Bible and he hoped that each school would endeavour to have the children memorize certain passages of the Word of God every Sunday.  
The Programme Committee of the Convention might indeed be congratulated upon having secured the services of such an experienced and faithful Sunday school worker as Mr. Thomas Yellowlees, Assistant Secretary of the Provincial Sunday School Union. Mr. Yellowlees gave a most delightful and practical exhibition of the teaching of a Sunday school lesson. He possesses the art of making the lesson very interesting and also at the same time being able to draw new thoughts and questions from his hearers. He taught the lesson for the following Sunday and it was a great help in showing the teachers how to teach.  
After the singing of an hymn the Rev. E. A. Langfeldt gave an address on "Qualifications of Sunday School Teachers." The speaker referred to the high standard of Christian character the Bible gives to everyone and, being conscious of his own shortcomings of what he ought to be, he fully realized how unworthy he was of pointing out to the audience the qualifications of a true child of God, for that, he thought, each Sunday school teacher ought to be. He drew his lessons, first, from St. Andrew, who, after he had found his life in a look at Christ, was so anxious that his brother, Simon Peter, might find the same life, and therefore he brought him to Jesus. Secondly, he referred to the experience Moses had when he saw the burning bush in the wilderness. Moses, like the useless and withered bush; God, the fire, emblem of consuming power and disintegrating might. Thirdly, the greatest proof of the truth of Christianity to be found in the character of Christ. Applying these three points to Sunday school teachers, Mr. Langfeldt said that the teacher ought to be, first, desirous to bring others to Jesus to get eternal life from Christ; secondly, he ought to be conscious of his own nothingness and of the omnipotence of God; and thirdly, he ought to exhibit the character of Christ in his daily walk and life. It matters not so much what one said, but how one lived. A Christlike life had converting power.  
After the singing of another hymn the Nominating Committee presented its report, which was as follows:

The Report was put to a vote and the officers were elected unanimously.  
The afternoon session closed with prayer and benediction by the President.

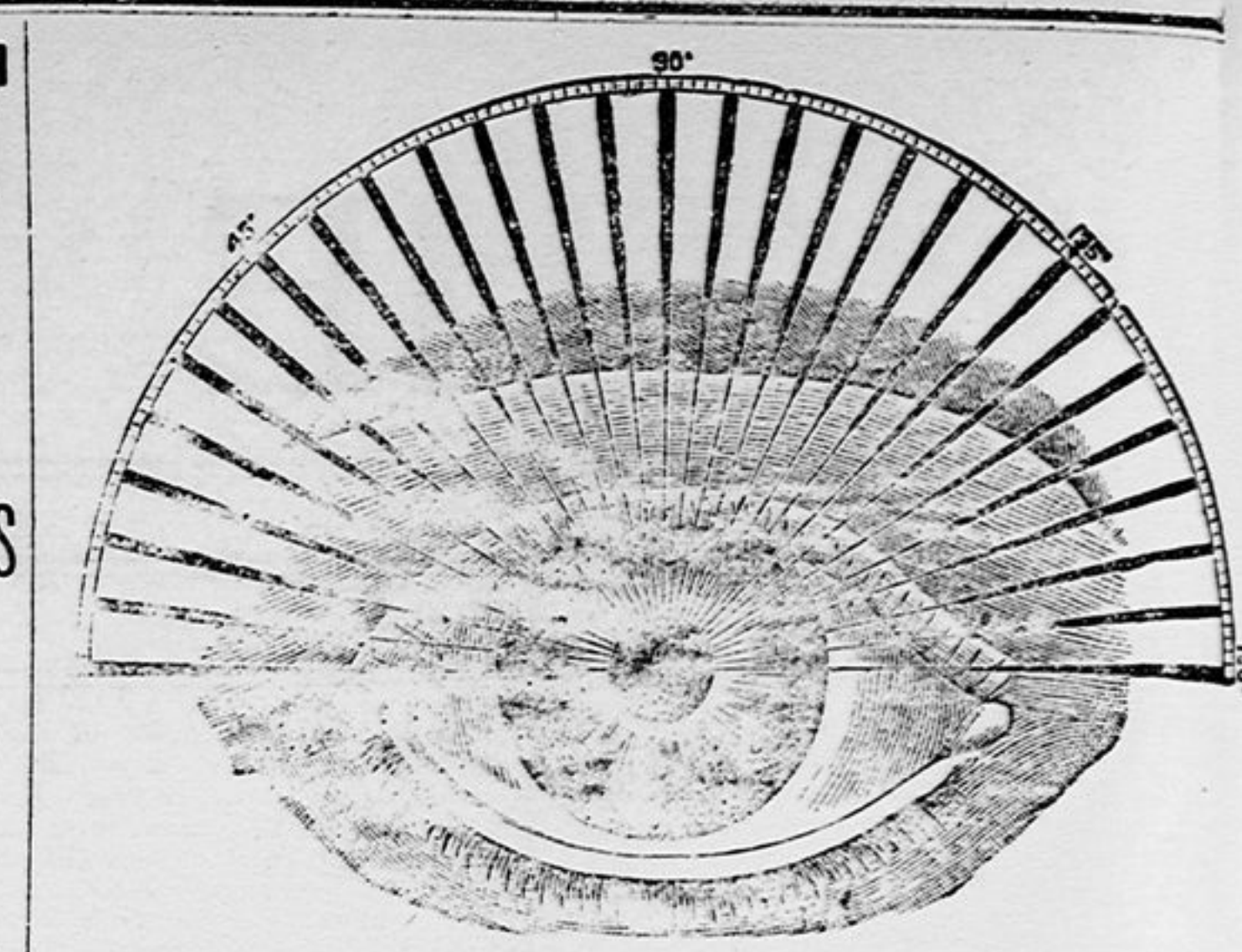
