British House of Commons Has the Largest Rody of Law-Maker.

The largest parliamentary body of lawmakers is the British House Commons, the membership of which is 670. The French Chamber of Deputies, representing a constituency numerically smaller than the British Commons, has a membership of 584 the Italian Parliament 508, the Hungarian House of Representatives 453 the Spanish Cortes 431, the Austrian Reichsrath. 425, and the German Reichstag, the smallest of the European Parliaments, 397.
