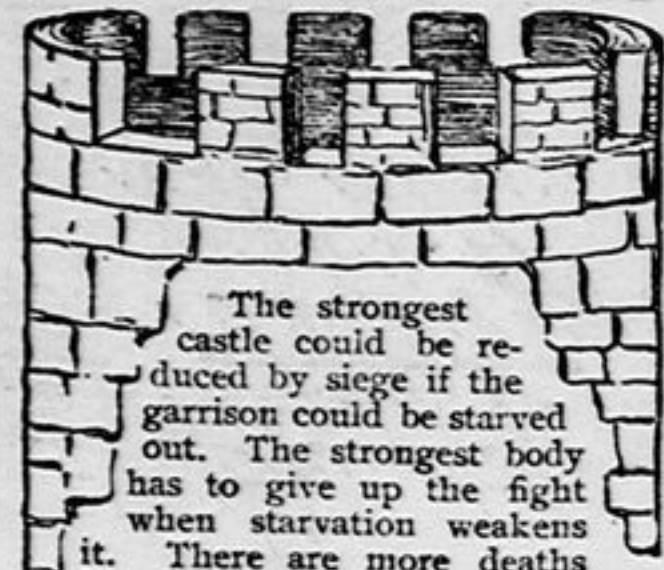
Mrs. A. H. Toole and Mrs. T. Z. Webster spent Thursday with friends in Lindsay.

**FOOT BALL NOTES.**

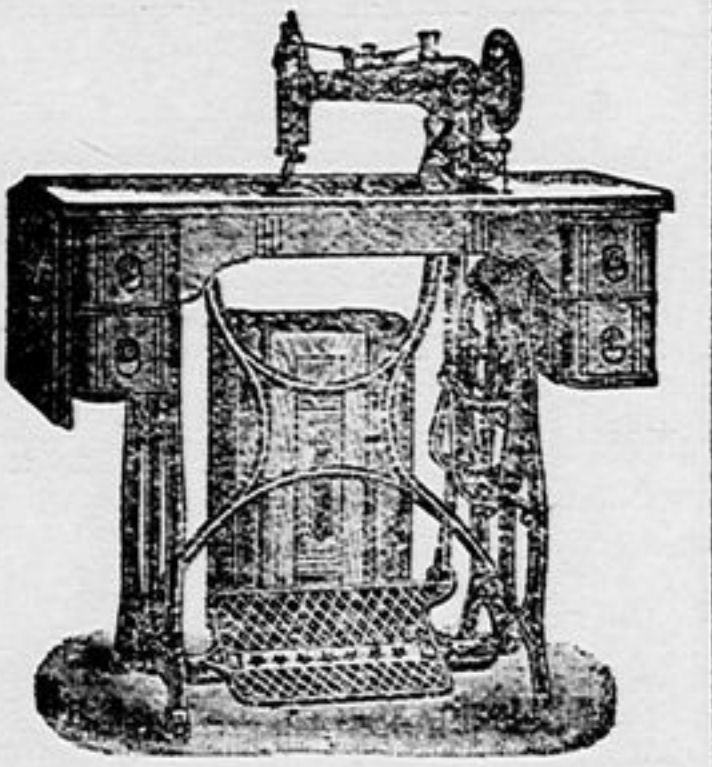

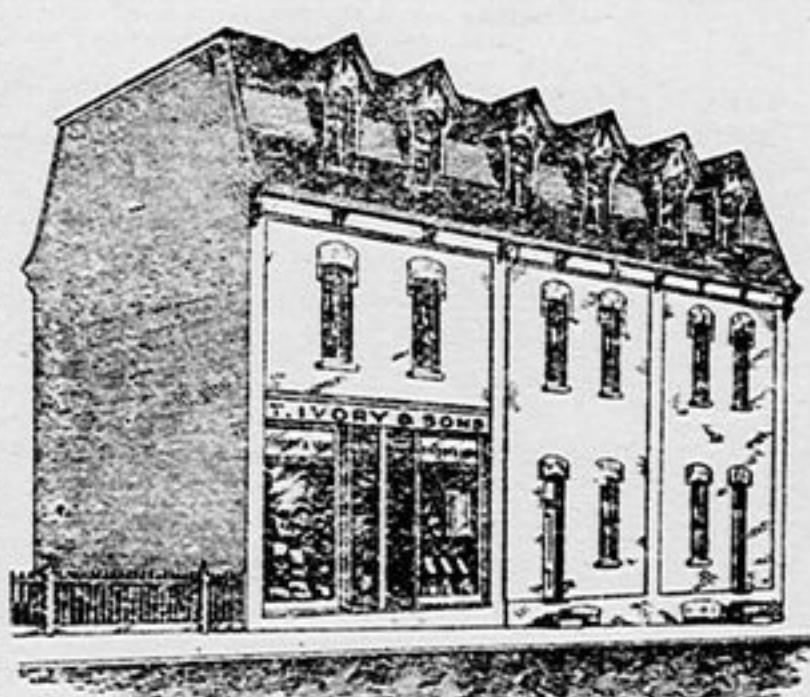
