

In this year of our Lord 1903, a new publication in Ontario has sprung to birth and fairly started on its harmonious way, to wit, "The Moon." It is Canada's only satirical paper, and it takes as its motto, "There is a pleasure in being mad, which none but madmen know."-Dryden. Has such a papera claim upon the reading public? Has it a call, as the parsons say, to perform missionary work among a people too intent upon business and political pursuits of life? Does it help in any way nation? In short, has it a function? There is food for thought in these questions. Some years ago a similar paper, "The Grip" was started in Toronto, edited by that noted cartoonist, J. W. Bengough, but it lived not the allotted span of life, and it passed into history before its usefulness had been given a thorough test, and before its age could give it prestige in the literary world. As is often the case, however, the failure of an enterprise does not, in the long run discourage, but acts as stimulus to further activity. Strange as it may seem, failures are necessaries in life and without them there would be little progress. The birth of "The Moon" is the proof of this. It remains to be seen whether it will survive the tender age of youth and reach sturdy maturity. There is reason for us to believe that it is here to stay. 
