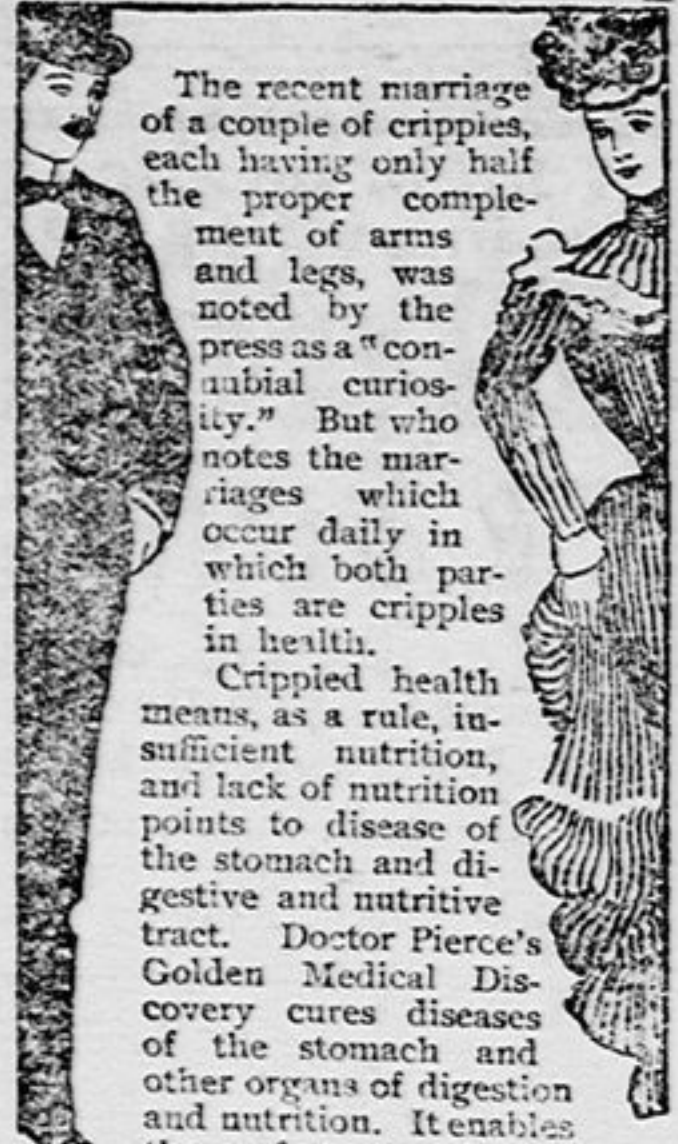
Mr. Jas. Cunningham is home from Toronto, and we are pleased to learn his sight is somewhat improved.

The Satirical Paper.

In this year of our Lord 1903, a new publication in Ontario has sprung to birth and fairly started on its harmonious way, to wit, "The Moon." It is Canada's only satirical paper, and it takes as its motto, "There is a pleasure in being mad, which none but madmen know."

What is there in Punch, Life, and others of a similar kind to keep them before the public eye? These papers are devoted to wit, humor and satire, and give expression to these in prose, poetry and picture.

No reasonable person will deny the influence of the stage for good; i. e. of course the moral stage. The stage that pictures to us life as enacted in the past and present.

The function of the satirical paper is almost of a parallel nature to that of the stage. It caters to the public along the same lines. But in some respects it has greater potency, especially in that department of the paper where the cartoonist with a few bold strokes of the pencil represents to the public in a humorous or ludicrous light, the actions of public men and of nations.

At the present time there is a tendency of men, men from the old school, who, in some manner, largely through accidents and having a fair amount of ability, have reached a certain degree of distinction, to come over to this side of the water to display their knowledge and experience upon the lecture platform, or their meagre amateur theatrical ability upon the stage.

To-day an Earl, a real live Earl—chews scenery for two hours for twenty-five cents. It matters not that the Earl of Rosslyn, who is now touring Canada and the United States with his own company, cannot act. Think of the example that he sets. From a mere Knight to an Earl is mighty step. The most difficult bridge is crossed. For the Duke of Deadbrokeski to follow the noble Earl's example will be comparatively easy. And after the Duke will come the King. And after the King the Emperor. And they will all use their own names on the bill boards—the Earl uses his. This is a masterly display of taste. Will it not be a rare treat to read, in glaring bill-board letters: "His Majesty, King Alfonso, and his own company, in Frou Frou. First appearance in America. One week only!"

There is no weapon, if used by skillful hands, more biting, more cutting and effective than that of satire and ridicule. Public men have gone down before it, and governments have been made to feel its force. This then is largely the mission of the satirical papers, and in carrying out this mission its pages are interwoven and mingled with wit and humour. The Moon is worthy of support by the Canadian public, and if it receives just encouragement it will rank before long with the best papers of its kind published in the world. W. R. Stead, editor of the "Review of Reviews" writes that some of its cartoons rank with the best in the world. This is strong praise for a paper in its infancy. We believe that in time, it will have in its own way as much influence for good, and as great an effect in moulding and shaping public opinion in this fair Dominion, as any of the journals now enjoying public support in Canada.
